Be it ordained by the Mayor and Aldermen of the Town of Kingstree, C., in Council assembled and by the authority of the same,

Section 1: That every person, firm or corporation engeged in or intending to engage in any trade, business, occupation or profession herein-after mentioned in the Town of Kingstree, S. C., shall on or before the 15th day of January, A. D. 1923, obtain a license therefor in the manner
