was in her glory last Sunday, the Pastor preached two spellbinders (if there is such a thing in the gospel) for he delivered a great sermon in the morning on "The Wind and its Effect," showing what makes the wind; the periodic blowing of the wind; the points from which it blows;

The Doctor said that Paul was weak physically, bad sight, and was not the orator that Apolos or Cephas were, and with the leadership he possessed, and the opportunity he had had in beholding with his own eyes so much more than any of the rest of them, he counted these things a hinderance, and styled them "the thorn in the flesh," and satanic in their agency "the messenger of Satan to buffet me." But he satisfied himself in the final analysis in that he saw they had a counteracting influence

lest he should be exalted above measure." The Pastor said it is necessary that we have a thorn of some kind to keep us "going to God" for the messenger of Satan protected Paul is it is intended to protect us, and instead of going to God to have him move the thorn, we ask him for grace to overcome it and be of real service to Him. The Pastor is not preaching for shouts but get many of them; he is preaching to help the race and the nation, and through that the congregation is constantly growing and punctuality is one of the signs of development.

Next Sunday, 26th, the usual services will be had and all are invited. The Pastor will preach at 10:30 a. m., and 8 p. m., as usual. The Sunday School which is taking on new life and adding scholars every Sunday will meet as usual at 12:30 p. m. The Varick C. E. Society at 6:30 p. m. to 7:45 all are welcome. "These young girls" he said "lived in open adultery, dealt in bootlegging, and made the nights hideous by their actions." He appealed to the church to get off the stilts, stop putting on airs, let us at least be kind enough to them as to go among them and give them the Word of Eternal Life.

Monday night we gave the beautiful cantata, Jephthah and his Daughter to a full house, of white and colored. It was one of the best plays of the season. Mrs. J. C. White was the directress. Mrs. Sarah A. Walker presided at the piano, accompanied by Messrs. T. H. Pinckney and Alonzo P. Hardy, who played their clarinet and saxophone respectively.

Mr. Dennis H. Jackson played the leading role of Jephthah, while Miss Jessie Brown played the part of Iphigenia.

Dr. E. A. Adams and Bethel Metropolitan congregation turned out with us Wednesday in large numbers and helped us for the rally which comes off Sunday.
