The message was delivered with force and eloquence and there was evidence of its effect. Two new members came forward and joined as soon as the doors of the church were opened.

At the evening service the Pastor selected as a text Daniel shazzar the King of the Chaldeans slain." The night in the text was spoken of as a night of extreme intemperance when this wicked king and guests were overcome by the intoxicants which were served at this feast. On the other it was night of supernatural warning, when the hand was seen writing on the wall, the interpretation of which writing was that the kingdom was no longer his, but had been divided and given to the Medes and Persians.

The congregation was warned against sinful pleasures and of sudden death of this King Belshazzar. There were also many touching selections rendered by the choir adding thereby to the joy of the services.

DR. J. C. WHITE CONDUCTS REVIVAL MEETINGS AT PERRY AND PROSPERITY

I went down to Perry, a small town located in Orangeburg county, and there I assisted the Rev. W. S. Diggs in a revival meeting at the Piney Grove Baptist church.

The Piney Grove church is located at about two blocks from the Railway station. Rev. Mr. Diggs is leaving that church, which I think is a mistake because he is loved and respected as only few preachers are by their congregations. Mrs. Fleda Hall Diggs, his wife, the daughter of the later Dr. M. P. Hall, president of Friendship College, Rock Hill, S. C., visited the meeting with her daughter, Armeta. We had a glorious meeting. 12 members were received for baptism, the church was strengthened and revived. The people came there from far and near to hear the word. The Perry Union Institute is located at this place, with the Rev. E. L. Gordon principal. Prof. Gordon has been laboring for the uplift of his people in Perry for the past 25 years. The colored people of Perry are doing nicely, many of whom own their homes, and are well situated. Among them are the Martins, Deacon S. M. Mitchell, J. M. Kitchings, and others.

There are numbers of young men and women in the community. I hope some, good, Godfearing, consecrated minister will get that church. This week finds me at the Antioch Baptist church, Prosperity, the Rev. L. C. Crafton is pastor. Rev. Crafton's wife is an intelligent young woman and the people of Prosperity love them both. Large crowds are in attendance here, several professed saving faith in Jesus Christ last night (Monday). I preached on "What Shall I Do to Be Saved." This is a shouting people—and when I had gone to my room I could hear them still shouting at one o'clock and women and men "coming through" with religion.
