WIFE TRIES TO COLLECT 25 YEARS OF SUPPORT MONEY.

Camden, N. J., Sept.—When Arthur Shinn and his wife, Mary then living at Somers Point, this city, separated 23 years ago, they had an agreement by which he was to pay her \$3 a week. Not until Monday did the woman endeavor to make her husband, now living in a nearby village, make good.

She had him arrested and he was arraigned before Judge Cleary on a non-support charge, but owing to the unique features in the case it was adjourned pending further inquiry.

Shinn is 50 years old and his wife 10 years his senior. She said that 23 years ago they had a "spat" as a result of his visiting another woman and that she left with their three children. Two have since died. Shinn avowed his wife had simply left, but he admitted making the agreement. Mrs. Shinn explained that she had not before sought support because she had lived with relatives, but they have since died.
