C., Oct.-Wallace Powell, an eighteen-year-old white boy, was found guilty in the Wake county Superior court here of an attack under arrest attempted to escape, but on Mozelle Jones, 14 year old colored girl. The white boy had admitted his guilt in the city court, and was sentenced to six months on the road. The conviction in Superior Court came on appeal.
