ZION BAPTIST CHURCH NEWS.

At 8:30 the pastor Dr. J. C. White, Sister Lula Johnson, the great spiritual singer of Jacksonville, Fla., the Rev. Lyda Crook (white) his wife, Mrs. Lola, and son, Mr. Vincent Crook of Central High School, Central, S. C., visited the State penitentiary to hold morning services with the convicts.

The Rev. Lyda Crook is a white preacher of West Asheville, N. C., one devoted to the cause of the Lord. Rev. White met him on a recent trip to Asheville and invited him down to preach at Big Zion and to speak at the State penitentiary. Bro. Crook brought along his wife, who is also a young white woman of rare Bible training and his son who is in the school at Central.

The services were brief. Dr. J. Dean Crane, prison chaplain, conducted the services. Sister Johnson sang some touching spirituals that visibly affected the entire prison body of about 1000. Rev. Crook preached a short sermon which was full of life and hope.

Visited the Death House.

We then visited the death-house and had prayer with those who are sentenced to the death chair. There are four at present in the death-house. One white man and three Negroes; one young man from Pickens who is to die on the 6th, of next month. This boy can neither read nor write, and it is pathetic to know that he must die and even can't read.

10:00 A. M. found us in our Sunday School—Mrs. Lola Crook taught the Berean Class or the Pastor's Class. Sunday School over we soon repaired upstairs in the auditorium. Rev. Crook preached one of the greatest sermons heard in Zion for years from the text: "These shall go away into everlasting punishment but the righteous into life eternal." It is share folly to talk about white folks can't preach. The congregation was large.

Our pastor, Dr. White, preached the funeral sermon of Bro. Charley Stevenson at 1:30 using as a text: "For God shall wipe all tears from their eyes." Dr. White declared that Jesus Christ broke up every funeral He attended while on earth. A large body of the Railroad Brotherhood, white and colored attended this service.

At New Brookland.

At 3:00 P. M. Pastor White motored over to New Brookland. The church was crowded. Dr. White presented a young white man, a licentiate preacher of New Brookland, Bro. Clend Benton, who preached a great soul-stirring sermon using these words: "When thou maketh a vow unto the Lord, pay thy vow." Rev. Moss of First Nazareth prayed a soul-stirring prayer following this sermon. Then Dr. Dudley of Savannah, Ga., opened the doors of the church. Then Dr. White baptized nine happy souls and after fellowshiping the candidates, he gave communion to the church.

6:00 P. M. Dr. White preached to the students of Benedict College, and at 8:00 P. M. preached his closing sermon of the day at Big Zion using as his text: "Thy Kingdom Come." Dr. White is conducting his revival at Shandon Annex, Shiloh Baptist. Rev. A. P. Porter is doing the preaching; and he is doing some real preaching.

There will be a big baptizing at Zion Pilgrim, Arthurtown next Sunday afternoon, when our pastor finishes his revival work at that point.

Zion Elects New Organist.

At the regular conference monthly meeting on Thursday night of last week Zion Baptist Church elected Mrs. Elise Pinckney King as our new Organist. Mrs. King is a teacher in the Waverley Graded School and was raised from a child in our church. She is a graduate of Benedict College. Mrs. King was our organist once before her marriage.
