He preached Thursday night of last week to a packed house of 3,000 people, the people of Columbia were carried away with him, that they demanded that an extra service be put on and that he preach at three o'clock. In spite of the hard down pour of rain, Zion Baptist Church was packed up and down stairs. It is estimated that 2000 people were there. Before starting congregation took \$50.00.

Orlander Mitchell preached from the text: "Jesus, thou Son of David, have mercy on me." Last Thursday night the boy preacher took in 11 converts. Sunday afternoon he had 4 converts. It was a most wonderful meeting we have ever seen before.

## Sunday Night Great Service.

At first dark not another person could get standing space up or down stairs when Dr. Mitchell arose to preach. He used as a text, "Put on the whole armor of God." This was the most exciting services we have had in these great meetings. 12 converts united with the church. Hundreds of people were shouting and giving God praise. This revival is shaking Columbia. The famous spiritual song at Zion is "Satan your kingdom must come down."
