Pressure Needed To Have Negro Named Governor of Virgin Islands

St. Thomas, U. S. Virgin Islands - (ANP)-Unless Negro Americans on the mainland become very active and outspoken, the next governor of the Virgin Islands will not be a Negro, according to reliable information reaching here from Washington.

Those interested will have about two months to convince President Eisenhower since the present governor, Morris F. DeCastro, was officially notified last week that a new governor will be named by the end of the year.

DeCastro, a native, succeeded William H. Haglie in 1949, after he became judge of the U. S. Circuit Court of Appeals in Philadelphia. While De Castro is white, he is local, served 30 years in the government, and has been a strong advocate of equal rights against any newspapers who would turn the Virgin Islands into a Bermuda, Nassau or Miami Beach, so far as race discrimination is concerned.

Since the election of President Eisenhower, the local governorship has been regarded as one of the plums for a faithful Republican. Both here and on the mainland, there has been the greatest interest and about 35 persons have thrown their hats in the ring. The governor is appointed by the president, upon the recommendation of the secretary of the interior. The appointment must be confirmed by the senate.

Since President Truman appointed Haglie governor, the first Negro American to hold such a position, this post has been seen as one place where the U. S. A. may demonstrate its willingness to include colored people among its important appointments.
