STEERING COMMITTEE OF S. C. CONFERENCE ON EDUCATION APPOINTED BY FORMER GOV. EISENHOWER UPON REQUEST OF PRESIDENT EISENHOWER

The Steering Committee of the South Carolina Conference on Education appointed by former Gov. Byrnes, upon the request of President Eisenhower, met at Columbia yesterday to plan and to organize a comprehensive study of educational problems confronting the people of the State of South Carolina...

WHITE HOUSE CONFERENCE ON EDUCATION to be held later in the year. To further this study the 83rd Congress, by the enactment of Public Law 530, appropriated funds "to assist each state to bring together, prior to the White House Conference on Education, educators and other interested citizens to discuss educational problems in the state and make recommendations for appropriate action to be taken at local, state and federal levels."
