Morris College Is Owned And Operated By The Baptist Educational And Missionary Convention of South Carolina

Morris College located in Sumter, S. C., was founded in 1908 by the Baptist Educational and Missionary Convention of South Carolina. The College is located in the city limits and has developed a lovely physical plant valued more than one million dollars. The Campus represents a beautiful scene with a spread of oak trees and a lovely green lawn.

Through the years, Morris College has offered many opportunities for cultural growth and development. A large percentage of the Elementary Teachers in our state received their undergraduate training at Morris College. Not only are students trained to become teachers, but courses are offered in Pre-law and Pre-med. Numbers of our graduates have gone into various businesses and professions.

The curriculum is divided into two major areas: The School of Liberal Arts and Sciences and the School of Theology. Courses leading to the following degrees are offered: Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Science in Elementary Education, Bachelor of Divinity, Bachelor of Science and Bachelor of Theology. From this system have sprung forth outstanding Negro leaders of the state as well as qualified and efficient public school

teachers.

Morris College is dedicated to the task of providing the basic fundamentals of Christian and intellectual training for its students. The College affords each student the opportunity to develop a well integrated personality, ideal habits of individuality and thereby enables him to assume a leading role in his community and society. Moreover, the school strives to promote scholarship, build character and to engender refinement of life.

For the past five years, Morris College has staged an expansion program. The following buildings have been added: I. D. Pinson Memorial Library, Garrick-Boykin Gymnasium, H. H. Butler Science Hall, Mabel K. Howard Home Economics Building and a Student Center.

Presently, Morris College has on a \$300,000 Endowment Drive. Plans are being developed for a new chapel and a new dining Hall.

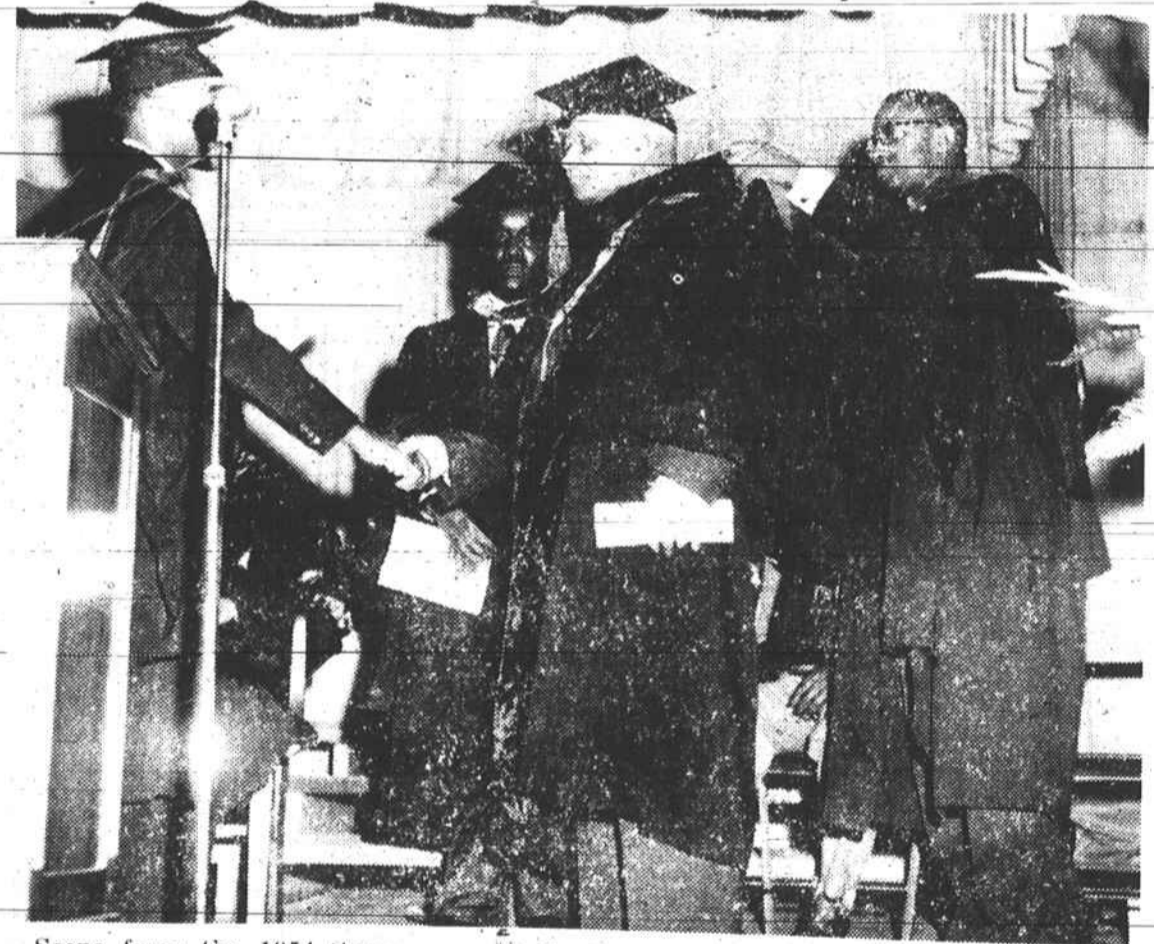
