basis. The Special Segregation Committee said the state was well prepared to handle any integration problems and that no new laws were needed.

TENNESSEE—Thirteen Negro first-grades out of an estimated 26 eligibles registered without incident in previously all-white schools in Nashville. Clinton High School registered additional Negro pupils.

TEXAS—No new districts were reported desegregating (new state laws restrained some which had

planned to do so) and a special "Southern School News" survey turned up 122 desegregated districts — 19 more than had been reported at the close of the last school year.

VIRGINIA — Four school districts are under court order to desegregate but all districts will open on the same segregated basis as last year. The state's Pupil Placement Board turned down applications of six Negroes in Arlington County for entry at all-white school there.
