Emerson said something like this, to give his thought in prose: "The mountain and the squirrel had a quarrel" and the mountain poked a good deal of fun at the little creature. The squirrel told the mountain that while it towered heavenward and could carry a forest on its back that it could not "crack a nut." Now, for the moral: There are people who feel themselves so full of importance that they refuse to admit that others have any ideas at all worth anything and this idea gains such a firm grasp on them and they become so biased that they refuse to support any enterprise or accept any ideas, however worthy they be, simply because the person giving the idea is not as "big" in their estimation as they deem themselves to be.

Let us put aside all grudges and little spites that unfit us for true and lofty citizenship. These little spites and the scales of self-importance may at times so completely blind us as to cause us to retrograde in a great many respects.

The mountain's view of the situation was narrow and should teach us that there is danger in any policy that leads us to wreck ourselves upon a sea of egotism. Broad-minded citizenship—a recognition of another's rights and a realization of the fact that we are not the "all-in-all"—is the need of any town in winning great achievements.

It is to be regretted that the oil mill could not be made to "go." A little too much division among us yet. Possibly we are all inclined to be egotistic and we let this quality in our "make-up" lead us astray, despite our own better judgment and the many precedents showing the folly of such a course. But we believe we are going to do a good business this fall.
