Be it ordained by the Intendant and Wardens of the Town of Canden, in Town Council assembled, and it it is hereby ordained by the authority of the same, that from and after the ratification of this Ordinanue, no person or persons shall permit or suffer his, her or their Swine or Goats to run at large within the limits of the town of Camden, and it shall be the duty of the Marshal, and he is hereby authorized and requested to employ persons to seize and secure every and all such Swine or Goals so running at large, to impound the same in the Public Pound, prepared impound the same in the Public Pound, prepared for that purpose, situated on Market-street, in the town of Camden.

And be it further ordained, That upon impounding any of said Swine or Goats, the Marshal hall immediately advertise the same at the Court House in Comden, giving a full and corresponding description thereof, and should the owner or owners thereof appear within two days thereafter, and offer satisfactory proof of and to said property, then the Marshal is authorized and directed to deliver to him, her or them the same, upon the payment of one dollar as a fine hereby imposed upon the owner or owners of every Swine or Gout which may be found so running at large and impounded as aforesaid.
