**An Ordinance,**  
TO prevent Swine and Goats from running at large within the Town of Camden.  
1. Be it ordained by the Intendant and Wardens of the Town of Camden, in Town Council assembled, and it is hereby ordained by the authority of the same, that from and after the ratification of this Ordinance, no person or persons shall permit or suffer his, her or their Swine or Goats to run at large within the limits of the town of Camden, and it shall be the duty of the Marshal, and he is hereby authorized and requested to employ persons to seize and secure every and all such Swine or Goats so running at large, to impound the same in the Public Pound, prepared for that purpose, situated on Market-street, in the town of Camden.  
2. And be it further ordained, That upon impounding any of said Swine or Goats, the Marshal shall immediately advertise the same at the Court House in Camden, giving a full and corresponding description thereof, and should the owner or owners thereof appear within two days thereafter, and offer satisfactory proof of and to said property, then the Marshal is authorized and directed to deliver to him, her or them the same, upon the payment of one dollar as a fine hereby imposed upon the owner or owners of every Swine or Goat which may be found so running at large and impounded as aforesaid.  
3. And be it further ordained, That should no owner appear within the time hereinbefore designated, (to-wit: two days,) or appearing, shall fail or refuse to pay the fine hereby imposed, then it shall be lawful, and it is hereby made the duty of the Marshal to expose at public sale each and every swine or goat so taken up and impounded as aforesaid, for the satisfaction of the said fine, and whenever the sale made by virtue of this Ordinance shall produce a sum exceeding that of the said fine, the excess or surplus shall be deposited to the credit of the Town Council, to be given to the owner of the property so sold, upon the same being demanded within thirty days after such sale.  
4. And be it further ordained, That all Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in any wise repugnant to, or contrary to this Ordinance, the same is hereby repealed.  
Ratified in Town Council assembled, this, the tenth day of September, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty one, and witness the hand of the Intendant and the seal of the said town of Camden.
