

Late from Europe.

ARRIVAL OF THE BALTIC. New York, April 5.—The steamship Baltic arrived this morning from Liverpool with dates to the 24th ult.

The sales of Cotton for the three days were 25,000 bales; of which Speculators took 9000, and Exporters 1000.

Trade at Manchester was less brisk, though it was in a healthy condition, and stocks were low. In France wholesale arrests are still making, and large numbers continue to be transported.

The Austrian Government has refused to concede anything to the Hungarian Committee, and the latter had left Vienna greatly enraged.

From England there is nothing important. Parliament is preparing for dissolution, and the approaching elections for the new Parliament absorb attention.
