## Arrival of the Pacific.

New York May 2.—The steamship Pacific lias arrived from Liverpool with dates to the 21st. She brings 83 passengers, and \$60,000 in gold.

### Additional by the Pacific.

New York, May 3 .- The Liverpool Cotton market on Wednesday (the day of the Pacific's departure) opened firmly. A motion had been carried in Parliament for an investigation of the affairs of the East India Company. The amendment to the Passengers Act is yet under consideration, and Sir J. Pakington announced the determination of the Ministry to communicate with the United States Government upon the subject. The Court of Exchequer had decided that Mr. Solomons, the Jew, was not entitled to a seat in Parliament.

In France the protest of the Orleans family against the confiscation of their property, was brought up in Court. The President denies the jurisdiction of the Court. Judgment was deferred. The Budget shows a deficiency of forty millions of francs.

SPAIN.—The remaining prisoners of the Lo-PEZ expedition were daily expected at Gibralter, on their way home.

Good.-The editor of the Washington Union attempts to defend himself by showing that he is atttacked both by the Southern Press and Liberator, and argues that because he is condemned by two antagonistic parties, therefore he is right.
