PROCLAMATION. BY THE PROVISIONAL GOVERN



EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENS, S. C., ) September 4, 1865.

WHITEAS, A SEEMING CON FLICT of jurisdiction, having arison between the Civil and Military Authorities of South Carolina, under the Provisional Government of the State; and whereas, M jor General Gillmore, commanding the Department of South Carolina, having sought an interview with me, as Provisional Governor, in the presence of General Meade commanding the Atlantic States; and whereas, all matters giving rise to the seeming conflict were

adjusted and arranged with the consent and approval of Major General Meade: Now that fore, I, BENJAMIN FRANKLIN PERRY, Provisional Governor of the State of South Carolina, do proclaim and make known, that the termof this arrangement are as follows: "That in all cases where freedmen or persons of dor are concerned, the Courts of the Provost Marshal shall have exclusive cogs nizunce to try and adjust them, for the present; and that all other cases shall be heard and adjudicated by the Civil Courts, Municipal Authorities and Cival Officers, under and according to the laws of South Carolina That the Civil Courts shall be opened under the Provisional Government and all Civil and Municipal Officers be allowed to resume their official duties and discharge them freely without interruption

on the part of the Military Anthorities. That it is further understood General Gilmore will issue a military order, and Governor PERRY will in like manner, issue his Proclamation, making known this arrangement, which is to continue till Civil Authority is entirely restored in this State and the Government re-con-

PROCLAMATION BY THE PROVIS'L GOVERNOR.



SEPTEMBER 18, 1865.

WHEYEAS IT IS REPRESENTED that in many portio's of the State there is great disturbance and apprehension from lawless persons, who are thicving, marauding and committing acts of violence remote from the military garrisons stationed at the Court Houses; and whereas Brigadier General Ames, commanding the North-western portion of the State, has suggested the organization of a militia police force in each District of his command, to act in concert with his forces in preserving order and peace in the community; and whereas it is supposed that the other military commanders will have no objections to the aid and assistance on the part of the citizens in suppressing crime and main taining order; and whereas, also, it appears that President Johnson has same tioned and authorized the Provisional Governor of Mississippi to organize a similar force in that State, and has forbidden the military authorities there to bidden the military authorities there to

interfere with such organization.

Now therefore, I, BENJAMIN F.

PERRY, Provisional Governor of the State of South Carolina, do proclaim, or-der, and declare, that there shall be formed and organized in each Indicial District one or more militia companies tor home police, to act under and be auxiliary to the military garrison of such District in preventing crimes and preserving the peace of the District. The companies will consist of a Captain and three Lieutenants and eighty men, scattered over the district so as to be easily accessible from all points where any distur-bance may occur. When the companies are formed, they will report, through their Captains, to the respective Brig. Generals commanding in South Carolina, and to the Provost Marshals at the respective Court Houses, and from them receive their orders. When arrests have been made, they will turn them over to the civil authorities or bring them before the Provost Court Marshal for trial and available of the civil authorities. and punishment, according to the terms of agreement between Generals Meade and tilmore and myself as to the respective jurisdictions of the civil and military

authorities in South Carolina. This police guard will be voluntary in its organization, and should be composed of none but discreet persons of standing and character in the community, who are willing to render their services promptly when the occasion requires. It is thought that the bare organization of such forces throughout the State, will have a most salutary influence in preserving peace and order and in preventing erime. The evil doers will know that there is a power, ready at hand, to arrest them and bring them to justice. It is to be hoped that all good citizens will cheerfully render this service. It should be a post of honor, as it is, to guard and to protect the country.
