His affection and respect for his parents and sisters, was worthy of imitation. He was an obedient son, a devoted brother, a quiet yet useful citizen, and above all an humble follower. of the precious Redeemer things his last moments he often spoke of "Hame —of home and friends on earth—of home and friends in Heaven. We have thus good reason to believe, that the dead, he lives—the gone, he is not lost. "The dead are like the stars of day,
