A patrol commutation tax of four dollars each. Road commutation tax of three dollars each. On all transient dealers in produce purchasing for other markets, twenty-five dollars. For every dog owned or kept within the said town, one dollar. For keeping a billiard table, seventy-five dollars, and five dollars to the clerk of council. For a license to retail spirituous liquors, fif y shollars per annum. For all shows and public entertainments for hire, except those for a charitable purpose, five dollars per day. Provided, however: That penalties or fines for violating ordinance's of the town shall not exceed twenty dollars for each offence. And the whole amount c. taxes on any town property shall not exceed one third part of the amount of the general tax paid by the owner on such property, and that no property s'all be taxed under this ordinance upon which a tax may have already been paid to the town for the same time under prewinus ordinances. Provided, furtier: That where the value of sales, factorages, faculties and professions shall be returned in Confederate treasury notes, the real value shall be estimated at one yeath the amount thereof.
