Proclamation.



By his Excellency JAMES L. ORR, Governor of the State of South Carolina. INFORMATION HAS BEEN COM-immicated to this Department, by the Hon. WILLIAM H. SEWARD, Secretary of State, that the President of the United States has relieved the Hon. D. F. PERRY from the further discharge of his duties as Provisional Governor of the State, and has remitted the "care and condition of the proper affairs of the State to the constitutional authorities chosen by the people."

This intelligence will be highly gratiffing, as it is an important step in the Soda, early restoration of the people to the enjoyment of all their civil rigits. It is the harbinger of the re-establishment of those friendly relations, in every section of the Union, which have been so long alienated and estranged.

In ent-ring upon the duties of . Constitutional Governor, it is proper that I should declare the present status of the State to the Executive Department of the Federal Government, and to the military authorities acting under the instructions of the President; so that the people, knowing, may yield prompt obedience to all lawful authority.

The order suspending the writ of Habeas Corpur, issued by the President has not been modified or revoked in this State, and the minifary authority is, therefore paramount in all such matters as they are instructed to take jurisdiction of, and as such will be respected by all orderly and law-abiding people.

The military claim jurisdiction in all cases of disjoyanty to the Government and refractions of its laws; to preserve order and discipline in and near their garrissons; to adjudge and determine all controversies in which freedmen or freedmen and whites are engaged, including violations of State laws by freedmen; in all eases of wrong or lejury done to its officers and soldiers; and is an auxiliary in aiding all Treasury agents to recover United States property, and the freedmen's Bureau in supervising contrasts of labor with freedmen. Whenever a person, therefore, is arrested by malitary authority on either of the above grounds, they have jurisdiction of the case, and are instructed not to obey may writ of Haleas Corpus for the relief of zuch per-

I therefore advise and admonish the people of this State not to allow themfriends and the public is respectfully selves to be inveigled or seduced by bad or misguided men into collisions with the solicited, military authorities. If the order of an D. F. FL officer is arbitrary, or the conductiof officer or private is illegal or oppressive, upon proper representations to the District commanders or to the distinguished commander of the Department, adequate and prompt redress will be afforded and the wrong doer properly runished.

In all controversics between citizens, arising out of wrongs or injuries done to person or property, and in all violations of the penal code by citizens, the laws are in full force, and the Courts will be open ed honceforth on every circuit to administer law and punish crime. The vicious, the lawless and the desperate will speedity be overtaken by justice and the majesty of the law recstablished and vindicated.

The colored people of this State who have neither land nor capital, are earnestly admouished to make contracts at once for labor for the next year They may be assured that the Government will not give them lands, stock or agricultural implements, nor will any food hereafter be furnished to those who are able to work. Those who will not work will very soon be immersed in vice, crime and disgrace. If the colored people really desire to elevate their race and make themselves respectable, it can only be attained by sobriety, industry, econo-

my and honesty.

It is the duty of the citizen, as it is a wise policy, to treat the freedmen with kindness, humanity and justice, and aid him to ameliorate and elevate his condition. Under such a policy, a majority of them will labor patiently and faithfully, and the eye will be greeted everywhere with blooming fields, fruitful harvest and well filled graneries.


