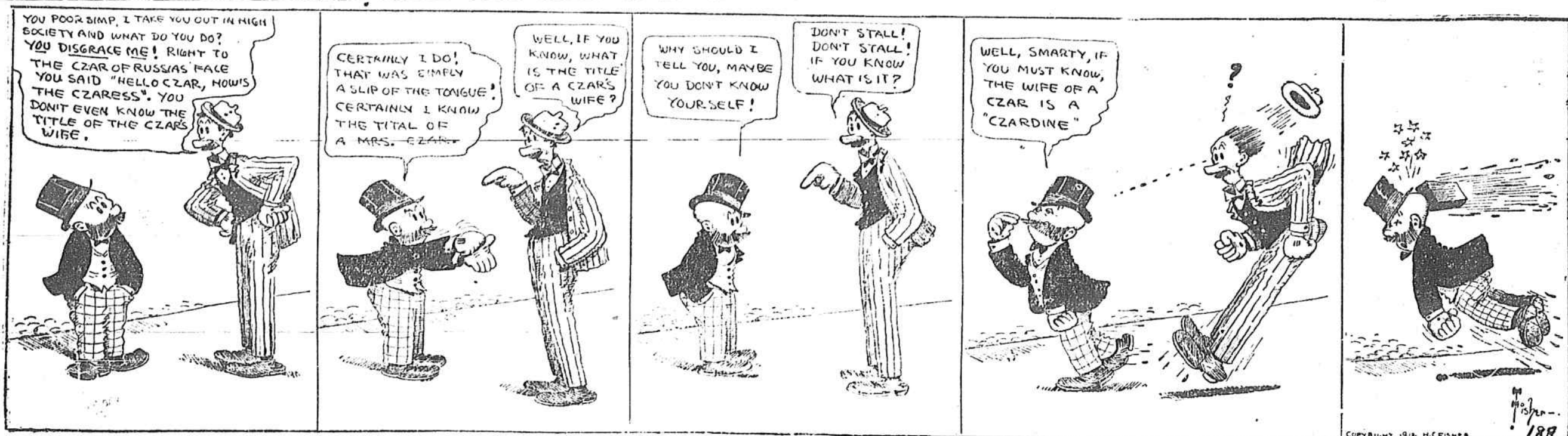

THREE SCHEDULED

But One Was Withdrawn—Three
Tracts in Brushy Creek Town-
Ship Were Sold

The public sales were made yesterday before a small crowd, owing to the rain which made it impossible for many to get to the city.

There were three sales scheduled but one of these, that of Builders Lumber and Supply company against Jerry Jones, involving a one-half acre lot in the town of Williamstow, was withdrawn.

In the case of S. A. Turner, Mary Ward, V. B. Turner and others against John Poole, David Poole, Emily Pearson, and others, judge of Probate Nicholson sold three townships. The first tract, containing 17 3-16 acres, was bid in at \$625; the second tract, containing 11 1-4 acres, was bid in at \$5.15 and the third tract, containing 35 7-10 acres was bid in at \$1,730. All three tracts were bid in by H. P. Burbage, attorney, from Greenville.

As trustee of the estate of the late Chas. C. Langston, Gen. M. L. Bonham sold the house and lot of Amanda Scott, situated on White street, this city. The place was bid in by Mrs. Lucy J. Langston for \$300.

A preliminary hearing has been given Wylie Berry, the negro who is charged with breaking into Mr. Richard Jones' house several nights ago, and he was bound over to a higher court on a charge of burglary. 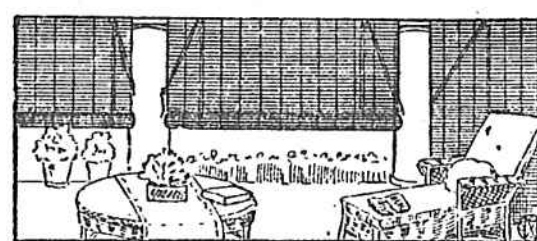
