OF GALICIA PLACED AT FOUR HUNDRED MILLION WAR LOSS IN PROVINCE

(By Associated Press.)
Vienna, April 3.—The total damage caused by the war to property in dealing with plans for the rebuilding of the province of Galicia is estimated at \$400,000,000 in a report prepared by the Society of Austrian Architects.

of the destroyed towns and village in Galicia.

The report states that nearly 100,000 of the inhabitants of the province have fled to Russia, while 60,000 families still remaining behind are homeless.

Of 689 villages in the war area, 271 are reported more than half destroyed. In the others there is generally some war damage, but the proportion varies considerably.

Altogether it is estimated that 177,000 business premises, private houses and farm buildings have been completely destroyed, to which number must be added about 25,000 public buildings. Assuming that the cost of reconstructing the buildings will average \$1,700, the total cost of this single item in the work of reconstruction after the war will be about \$350,000,000.

DECLINED PROPOSITION

Unable at This Time to Furnish Lights For Due West.

The Southern Public Utilities company's local office has notified the authorities in Due West that they will be unable to furnish the town of Due West with electric lights owing to the uncertainty of how long the Southern Power company will maintain their 40,000 volt line by Donalds. The Southern Power company, it is said, will change this line to one adopted to 100,000 voltage, but they are unable at present to say just when this change will be made. Insulation that might be installed for the 40,000 voltage line could not be used for the 100,000 voltage line, and with conditions as they are, it is impossible for the local company to install the lighting system.

200,000 Goats for Poor.

LEE LOONEY CARRIED TO FUNERAL OF WIFE BY THE SHERIFF

GIRL IN HYSTERICS

Pathetic Case of Children Who Have Lost Both Father and Mother

Eight children, three of them mere tots, in their little home a few miles below Belton, are today sadly awaiting the time when their father will be free to return to them. The mother of the little flock will never return. The shock following her husband's incarceration in the county jail and his subsequent admission of wholesale thefts in a number of Anderson's largest stores is said to have helped to send the faithful and gentle mother to a sick bed from which she never rose.

Events of sadness, grim in reality, transpired in the life of the Looney family in such rapid succession as to be almost beyond understanding. Just way Lee Looney is in jail the little brood of children, ranging from 1 to 17 years of age, cannot understand. Then, too, he was away from home much of the time and is not missed as is another member of that family—the mother. She died Sunday morning at the county hospital, practically alone, her husband being unable to come because of his crime against society, and the mother's main support, the 17-year-old daughter, staying at home to care for the children—the more dependent ones—the ones who couldn't understand—couldn't realize the grim part fate, or rather God, was playing in their young, uneventful lives.

The news of his wife's death came to Looney in his cell at the county jail, brought there by the kind-hearted jailer. The poor fellow was almost prostrated. Dumbly, silently and with staring eyes he gazed at his keeper as he told the story—told of the passing into the grim beyond of his helpmate—his truest, most steadfast companion, who believed in him until the last.

The sheriff and the jailer only too gladly agreed to accompany the bereaved prisoner to the cemetery. No sermon was preached because of the severe weather, but the broken hearted father, just from a prison cell, could see the face of his departed companion, gentle even in death. Later he saw the cold earth thrown over the plain casket, and turning to the officers, dry-eyed and broken in spirit, signified his willingness to return to jail. He walked off between them stumbly, mattering to himself.

The 17-year-old daughter, now said to be hysterical, was not in condition to even attend the funeral. Strong, kind, her mother's only real support in the trials that followed the imprisonment of their father, the girl gave way upon learning of the death of her mother, and is now almost as helpless as the one-year-old tot, who can't understand.

The funeral of Mrs. Looney was held yesterday morning at Silver Brook cemetery, and was quickly over. Following the burial relatives of Looney went to the jail, where they spent the afternoon in an effort to console the disconsolate father.

FATAL "APRIL FOOL"

Boy Shot by Sister Whom He Tried to Frighten

Cordale, Ga., April 2.—As the result of an April fool joke, when he and his older brother, Ed, dressed like negroes, and with their faces blackened, went to the home of their sister, Mrs. Lizzie Hill, about 3 o'clock and frightened her, George Calhoun, aged 14, was shot and probably fatally wounded by his sister.

The ball took effect in the left side and lodged in one of the kidneys. The wounded boy was removed to the local hospital, and is in a very precarious condition.

The two boys went to the home of Mrs. Hill and found her seated on the front veranda alone. In carrying out their joke they seized her. Failing to recognize either of them, she secured a revolver and fired several shots.

When she realized that she had shot her brother she became hysterical and is now prostrated and unconscious from grief.
