When it was learned that the Charleston trip must be given out, there was much disappointment on the part of those who had set their hearts on it. Since President Johnson had taken a great deal of trouble to arrange for the trip and the girls had not taken advantage of these arrangements, those of us who were anxious to go somewhere began to fear lest it might end by our having to celebrate Winthrop's birthday quietly on the college campus. Railroad and succeeded in getting satisfactory rates to Rust Mountain in North Carolina. After breakfast there was a rush for the back campus; for here just outside the college gates a train of four coaches and a baggage car was pulled up and was ready to start.
