

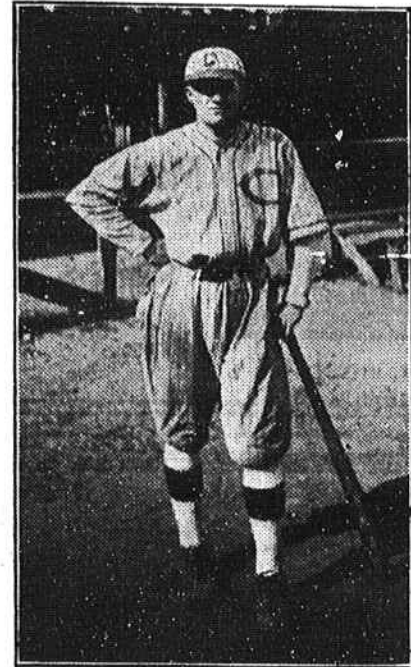
**EXAMINATION SCHEDULE.**
