Miss Venable is a granddaughter of Dr. Charles S. Venable, who taught mathematics at the old South Carolina College.

Dr. Coker, who is ranked as one of the foremost botanists in the country, is the author of a volume on mushrooms in the "American Encyclopedia of Botany." His most recent publication is "Trees of the Southeastern States."
