1900-1919

Thomas C. Law, '03L, president of Law and Company, consulting analytical chemists of Atlanta, who edited *The Carolinian* in college year of 1902-03, has written Harry Jenkins, Jr., '45A, editor of the student magazine, congratulating him and his student associates for their "courage and good judgment in re-establishing the University magazine". "One of my close ties with my Alma Mater seemed to be broken when in 1934 the publication of *The Carolinian* ceased", writes Mr. Law. "I was sorely disappointed when its reorganization lasted only two years, from 1938 to 1940. I trust now that it is back for good, and we who feel that we have had a part in its history will watch its progress with much interest."
