A number of veterans run the risk each month of allowing their National Service Life Insurance to lapse because they fail to take a premium payments, Edward B. Turner, manager of the South Carolina regional office of the Veterans Administration, said today

Each month, VA district offices receive checks, money orders, and postal notes that cannot be cashed, although they were intended to pay NSLI premiums. Many 275 points. 
