# Expansion Continues **OnCampus**

Despite some delays due to weather conditions, construction of new buildings at Carolina is continuing at a pace which should have all of them ready for occupancy next fall.

The addition to the College of Engineering, which extends the building to encompass the entire south side of the block between Sumter and Main streets, has been completed and accepted from the contractor. The addition includes a large classroom, laboratories and faculty offices

Razing of Steward's Hall, adjoining the College of Engineering, is virtually complete and construction will start in about two weeks on another small addition which will house additional offices for civil and electrical engineering faculty, a 150-seat lecture hall, and a meeting room for the student engineering society.

The 10-story women's residence hall at Pickens and Devine streets, which will be a major feature of the Columbia skyline, is rising steadily. The sixth floor is now being poured, and the general contractor and sub-contractors are hard at work and making good progress," said Dr. W. H. Patterson, dean of the university, who is in overall charge of new construction activities.
