

Chaplain Workshop Offered

The USC administration, along with the Campus Chaplains Association, will sponsor a one-day workshop for ministers Tuesday, March 30.

The purpose of the workshop is to allow ministers to spend a day with Carolina's chaplains and staff in order to enable these men to help the USC staff in preparing and sustaining USC students during their stay at the University.

Two representatives from each ministerial association in the state will be invited to the event, which will begin with an opening session on the aims and plans of Carolina, led by President Thomas F. Jones and Dean Charles Witten.

Four working sessions, including discussions on finances, academic goals and problems, campus life, and emotional factors, will be led by the following campus leaders: Paul Fuller, director of student aid; Dr. Charles Coolidge of the history department; Dean L. Eugene Cooper and Dean Elizabeth Clotworthy; and Prof. Velma Hayden, School of Education.

Throughout this week, the Alumni Association, in co-operation with the sororities and fraternities on campus sponsored a drive to raise funds for the Educational Foundation.

Fifty alumnae set up headquarters in the Alumni Office in Lieber

College, and contacted, by telephone, the alumni of the Richland County area. When an alumni agreed to contribute, a sorority member was driven by a fraternity member to the place of business or the home of the contributor to collect the donation.

Miss Kay Tolbert volunteered as chairman for the sororities and Doug Buchanan was in charge of the fraternities. Approximately 80 sorority women and 24 fraternity men participated in the drive.

E. Smythe Gambrell of Atlanta, a past president of the Bar Association, offered the Alumni Association a unique challenge. If it succeeds in increasing its total membership by 1,000 and raises \$25,000 toward its Educational Fund by May 20, Gambrell will present the Alumni Association with a \$10,000 check at the graduation exercises in the spring.

Both Monday's and Tuesday's endeavors were very successful. Over 150 new contributors were

contacted, and \$1,000 was collected each day.

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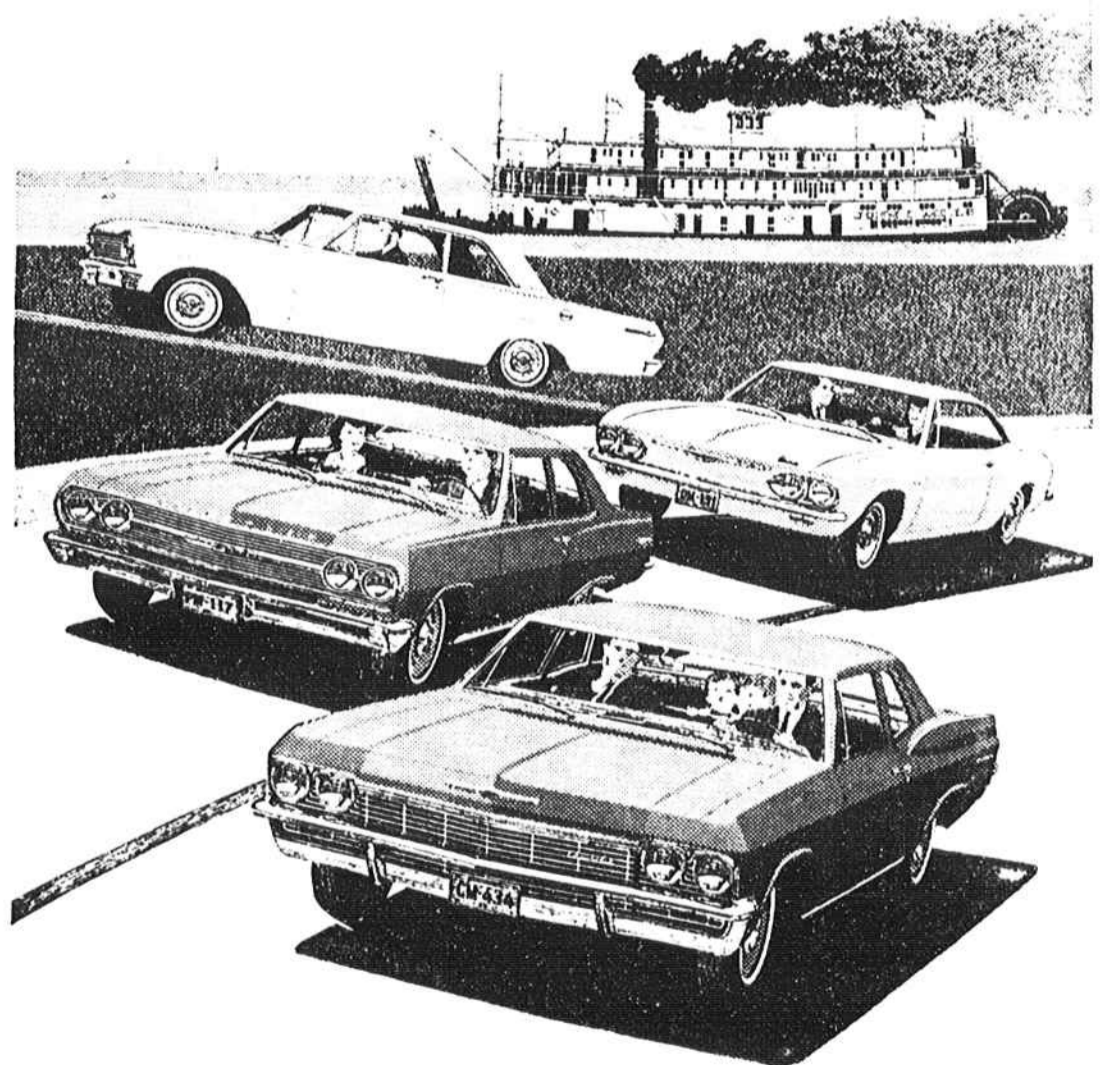
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
