

Dr. Salzberg Named Director Psychological Service Center

Dr. Herman C. Salzberg, a specialist in psychotherapy, has joined the University of South Carolina department of psychology as director of the department's Psychological Service Center.

Dr. Salzberg formerly held administrative and teaching positions at the Veterans Administration Hospital in Augusta, Georgia.

Dr. Salzberg, who received the doctor of philosophy degree from the University of Tennessee, was also consulting psychologist to the Georgia State Department of Education and state director of vocational rehabilitation.

The USC Psychological Service Center was established last year as a research, training and clinical facility. It provided diagnostic and counseling services to faculty,

students, staff and their families, as well as to the general public.

Counseling services of the center enable individuals to function more effectively in their work, in the community and in personal relationships through improved emotional adjustments.

In addition to Dr. Salzberg, the center is staffed by Dr. William T. Drennen, associate director;

Dr. Robert V. Heckel, director of clinical training in the department of psychology; and Dr. Carl Insalaco, a specialist in mental retardation.

Assisting these staff members are graduate extern students who already have master's degrees or have done equivalent advanced study.

These students receive practical experience while working under

the staff's supervision, related Dr. Salzberg.

University-connected individuals may receive diagnostic and evaluative services without charge, but are required to pay a minimum fee for psychotherapy and treatment.

Clients may be referred to the center in several ways. An individual may refer himself by calling or visiting the center. The faculty, infirmary or one of the other University counseling services may refer a University-connected individual.

A professional person such as a physician, a minister or a community agency may also refer persons.

Facilities for the center are on the fourth floor of Barnwell College.

Faculty Increases Numbers, Degrees

More than 50 per cent of Carolina's new faculty members hold doctorate degrees, according to H. Willard Davis, vice president for

academic affairs. Joining the faculty for the fall term are 90 new teaching faculty, increasing the University's total instructional staff by 54 members.

Twenty-two fields have gained new instructors. The greatest increases occurred in the English department and the School of Education, which gained nine instructors each.

An increase of eight instructors enlarged the History Department. Three academic areas gained six instructors each: the School of Business Administration, the foreign languages department, and the School of Nursing.

The College of General Studies, the Math Department and the Psychology Department each increased their teaching staff by four members.

Gaining three new instructors were the Art Department and the Physical Education Department.

Two new faculty members have joined the Geology Department, the Law School, the Political Science Department, the Naval Science Department and the Anthropology and Sociology Department.

Six departments have gained one professor each: Biology, Chemistry, Geography, International Studies, Music and Philosophy.

According to Alexander, much of the life at Wesley is motivated by student participation.

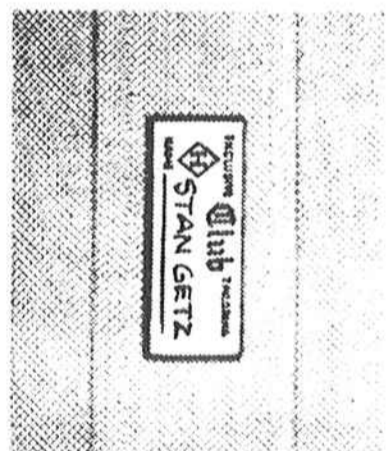
