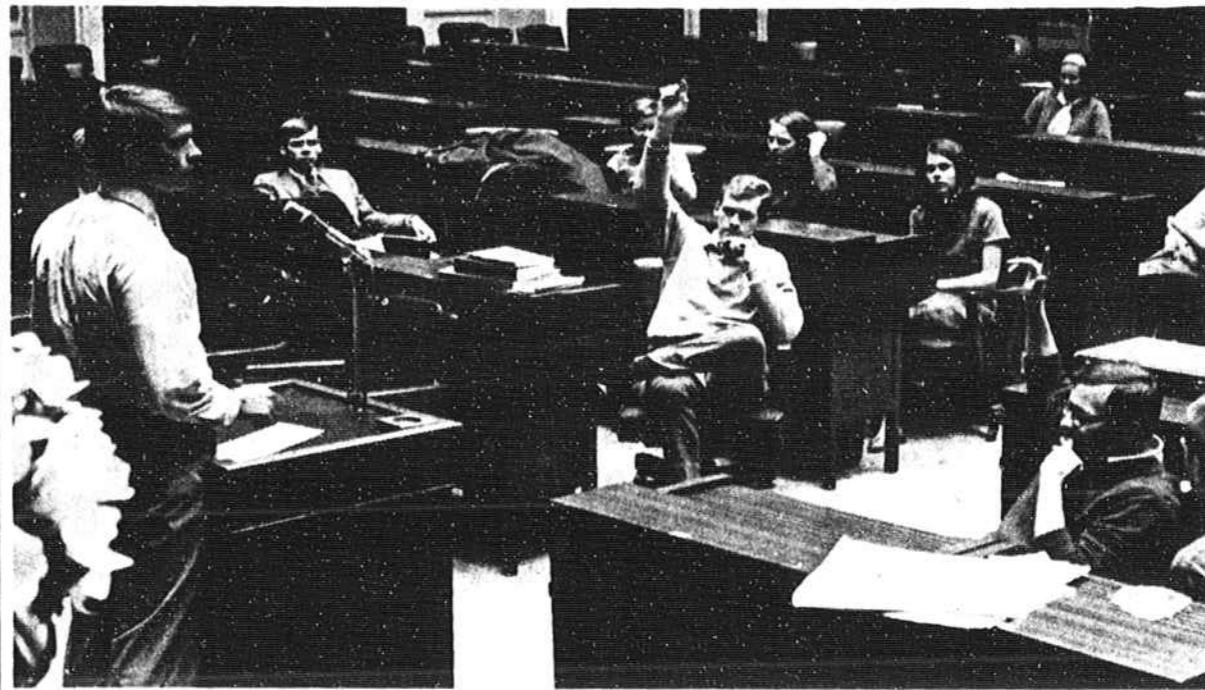
Textile Discussion

South Carolina Student Legislature Will Propose State Law Changes

USC student representatives will get a chance to suggest changes in South Carolina laws when the South Carolina State Student Senate Legislature convenes Dec. 4-7.

All South Carolina colleges plan to send representatives to the legislature's House and Senate branches. This year's assembly will be held at the State House in Columbia.

Each college sends two senators

and one representative for every two hundred and fifty students. USC plans to send a total of forty-seven senators and representatives.

The State Student Legislature is a type of lobbying body for college students. It holds an annual conference where bills are presented, debated, and voted on by the college representatives. The final results are reported to the South Carolina State Legislature in order to present the college students' views on various issues.

This year the USC delegation plans to introduce bills ranging from raising the speed limit five m.p.h. to placing student members on the boards of trustees of South Carolina colleges.

Other bills include putting liquor legislation on a county rather than state basis and allowing all South Carolina teachers to be exempt from state income tax in substitution for teacher pay raises.

David Eckstrom, vice president of the USC student body, plans to introduce a bill which would ex-

empt all new South Carolina industries from all state taxes for their first five years in operation. As legislation now stands all new industries are exempt from all state taxes except property and educational tax. Eckstrom's bill would remove these taxes as well.

BSU Has Statewide Convention

The Carolina and Columbia College Baptist Student Unions will be host to a state-wide meeting this weekend of the S. C. Baptist Student Convention.

Several University students and graduates will speak on their experiences as student missionaries last summer.

Among the students speaking Saturday afternoon are Marvin Crosland, Frank Timmerman and Wilma Duke, who served at Myrtle Beach with drama, and Betty Roebuck who served in Rhodesia.

Other speakers during the three-day meeting that begins Friday evening at First Baptist Church include Dr. Benjamin Payton of Benedict College, Dr. William Hendricks of Southwestern Theological Seminary, the Rev. Nathan Porter of the Home Missions Board of the Southern Baptist Convention and the Rev. Louis Cobbs of the Foreign Missions Board.

USC student Terry McCoy, music chairman of the student convention, is in charge of the music for the meeting. Some 400 students are expected.
