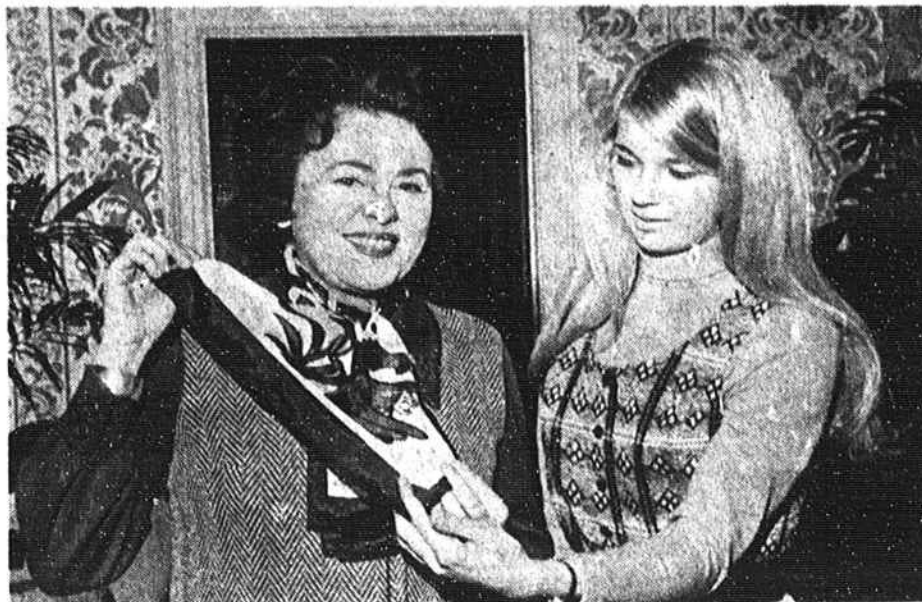
**NEIL ARMSTRONG WANTS YOU!**

## Psychedelic scarf wins

A psychedelic design by USC art major Kathy Shuler has been transformed into a scarf by the Educational Foundation.

Forty-five inches long the scarf displays two gamecocks on each end. At first glance the center seems a maze of lines in garnet and black. But when these lines are brought into focus they form a third gamecock.

Miss Shuler calls the third gamecock, "a stylized gamecock." "Stylizing is a way of shifting the lines of an object about," she said. "That way you can produce a picture which is not exactly what the real object looks like. But the object can still be recognized."

A blonde senior from West Columbia, Miss Shuler first heard of the Educational Foundation's idea for producing a scarf in her advertising design class last fall. At the time she was working on a stylized travel poster of the Grand Canyon and decided to try the same effect on a gamecock.

Her finished product is a 45-inch by 16-inch scarf in acetate twill. The scarfs are now on sale at the Education Foundation located at the University House, 1731 College St. They are \$3.50 if ordered by

mail or \$3.00 if picked up at the house.

Profits from the fund-raising project go toward the Educational Foundation's many activities which include the support of scholarships and professorships.
