Aluri founded the Columbia chapter of International Friendship Ministries in 1982.


A native of India, Aluri arrived in South Carolina in 1976 to study international relations at Carolina. Feeling, he said, like a "lost lamb" in a new surrounding, he decided to establish an organization offering spiritual fellowship to foreign students and internationals residing in

Columbia. More than 1,000 international students study at USC, representing 90 countries throughout the world. IFM gives them an opportunity to interact with fellow internationals and native Columbians as well. Regardless of a student's religious beliefs, Aluri said, all interested are welcome to join.

About 200 USC students take advantage of IFM services, which range from Friday night friendship dinners to trips to Orlando, Fla., during Christmas break. IFM also provides cultural discussions, Bible studies, an English communication skills program, an American host family program and housing facilities for internationals


