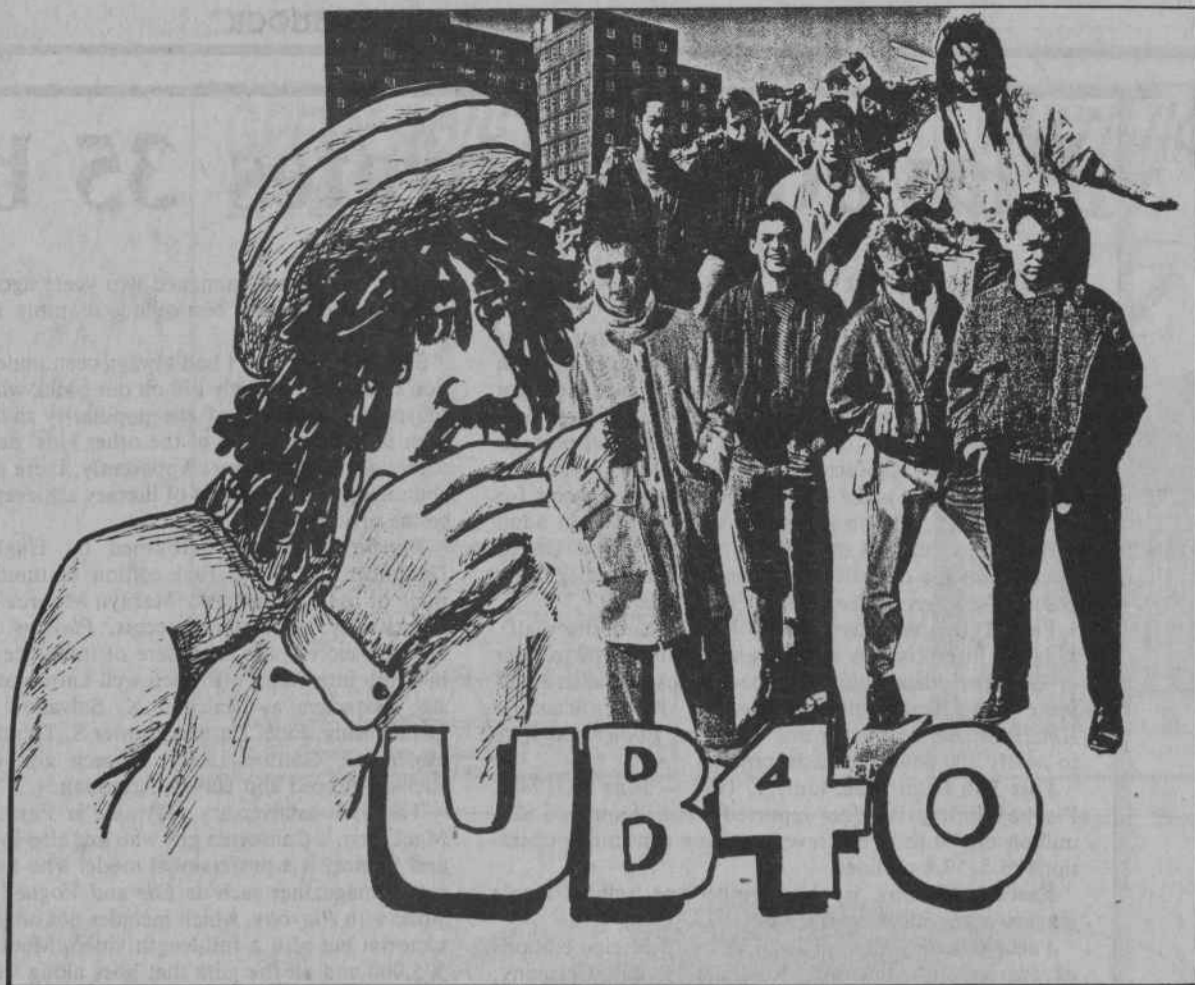

UB40 to entertain at the Township

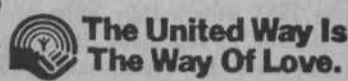
Do you like to sway to the riddims of reggae, mon? Well, Great Britain's UB40 will appear at 7:30 p.m. today at the Township Auditorium to satisfy da Rasta in all of us. UB40 is on tour in support of their most recent album, titled *UB40*.

UB40 came into the spotlight with its last album, *Labour of Love*, which contained the hit single, "Red Red Wine." That particular single hit number one in 12 countries when the album was released five years ago. The album and the single were, however, both relatively unsuccessful in the States until last May when J. J. Morgan, a deejay at KKFR-FM in Phoenix, Ariz., played the song. By the next day, "Red Red Wine" had become the station's most requested tune. The alcohol-promoting reggae song soon became a hit across the country, and UB40 was thrust into yet another number one slot.

UB40 is made up of eight members who have known each other since their childhood in Birmingham, England. In their earlier days, the eight boys rehearsed religiously trying to think of a master plan to conquer the world, and practiced their signatures for the awaited day they would be asked for autographs. Long hours of hard work and practice have brought about the band's own island sound, often accompanied by political and passionate lyrics. This, in addition to patience, has made UB40 successful throughout the world.
