Gamecocks swept at Virginia Tech

The USC baseball team's road woes continued this weekend in Blacksburg, Va., as June Raines' Gamecocks dropped three straight Metro Conference contests to the Virginia Tech Hokies. USC's road record is now 4-13.

Entering the weekend, USC was tied with the Hokies for first place in the Metro with a 6-3 conference mark, but the Gamecocks could not put their hitting and pitching together in any of the three contests to stop a Virginia Tech sweep. The losses drop USC to 23-15 and 6-6 in the conference, while the Hokies improve to 25-10 and 9-3.

In Friday's game, the Hokies took a 10-5 win despite two home runs from USC sophomore outfielder Brian Williams. USC starter and loser Brian Rountree, 4-6, was

Payne a finalist for Ohio position



In Sunday's first game, the Hokies took an early lead with two firstinning runs off Gamecock starter Matt Threehouse, but USC came back to tie it with two runs in the third behind an RBI single from second baseman Mark Taylor.

The Gamecocks took a 3-2 lead in the fourth when outfielder Skeets Thomas scored on a wild throw, but the lead would last only until the bottom half of the sixth, when the Hokies scored four runs on four hits off USC pitchers Threehouse, Brian Beatson and Charlie Young. Young, 3-3, took the loss for the Gamecocks, while Virginia Tech's ace Mike Williams improved his record to 8-2 with a three-hitter.

In the second game, the Gamecocks loaded the bases with one out in the top of the first, but short-
