

Raycom works out new five-year deal

By The ASSOCIATED PRESS A new basketball television contract between Raycom Sports and the Metro Conference would guarantee revenues of at least \$4 million for the league, according to a published report.

The Roanoke Times & World-News, citing unidentified league sources, said a new five-year deal is being worked out that would be-

gin with the 1990-91 season. Metro Commissioner Ralph McFillen confirmed there was an agreement in principle and said administrators at each of the league's eight schools - including Virginia Tech — are now considering the contract. Any deal must be finalized by late November, he said.

Depending on television ratings, each school could earn as much as \$1 million dollars over the duration of the contract. In recent years, the Metro Conference games have been among the highest-rated syndicated college basketball packages in the nation.

The Metro Conference includes Cincinnati, Louisville, Memphis

USC and Duke tie in double overtime

The USC soccer team tied South Region foe Duke in double overtime, 2-2, in Durham Sunday.

The Blue Devil's Brian Benedict scored the first and only goal of the first half at the 17:05 mark.

Mike Gosselin scored the Gamecock's first goal at the 46:47 mark to tie the score at 1-1. The assist was by Clark Brisson and Patrick Mihm.

Clark Brisson scored his fifth goal in three matches at the 63:26 mark in the second half for a 2-1 USC lead.

At 88:78, Duke's Darien Diedrich tied the score at 2-2 to send the match into overtime.

After a scoreless overtime, the game ended 2-2. It was USC's second consecutive tie, as the Gamecocks tied South Alabama 1-1 in double overtime at The Graveyard on Wednesday.

The Gamecocks are now 5-1-2 and play Erskine College at The Graveyard at 5 p.m. Wednesday. Duke's record moved to 3-2-1.

Green was also able to break the tackles of numerous Georgia Tech defenders.

"They were bigger than some of the other teams we've played," he said. "But they were too concerned with trying to come up and make a kill tackle and that hurt them."

Green is currently ranked 19th in the nation by the NCAA in rushing per game with a 110.3 yard average.

With his 139-yard effort, Green moved up to fifth place on the alltime USC rushing list with 2,486 career yards. Green needs 412 yards to reach second place on the all-time USC rushing list. Steve Wadiak is currently second with 2,878 yards. Heisman Trophy winner George Rogers tops the alltime list with 5,204 yards.

Ellis completed 21 of 33 passes for 185 yards and one touchdown, throwing to ten different receivers. It was the first time Ellis has not thrown an interception in a game since last year's East Carolina game, a string of 12 games.

Green rushed 29 times for 139 yards, his third 100-yard game this season. With the yardage, Green moved into fifth place on USC's career rushing list with 2,486 yards.

Mike Dingle also helped with the USC running attack as he rushed for 63 yards on 14 attempts, with one touchdown.


Georgia Tech rounded out the scoring on a 31-yard field goal by Sisson. The score capped an 11-play, 71-yard drive with 2:46 left in the third quarter.

USC twice tried to increase their lead, but Mackie missed two field goals of 19 and 50 yards.


A late interception iced the win for USC, who sat on the ball to run out the clock for a 21-10 margin of victory.

Woods praised the defense. "I thought we played good defense after the first quarter," Woods said. "We tackled hard, chased the football better, and we played more physical than we have in a while."

Next week the Gamecocks will face the Georgia Bulldogs in Athens. Kickoff for the game is scheduled for 1 p.m.






