Soccer tourney begins this weekend

Four of the nation's premier soccer teams will be playing at The Graveyard this weekend as USC plays host to the third annual Met Life Classic.


USC, Akron, Howard and UCLA will be participating in this year's tournament.



USC: The Gamecocks, coming off a season that ended in the NCAA semi-finals, are 13-2-2. USC is led by junior Clark Brisson, who has scored 19 goals this season, and freshman Ruben Tufino, who has 14 assists. This past year's leading scorer, Jonas Gudjonsson, is also back on offense. Team captain Tommy Loeber, Scott Henderson and Arnar Jonsson anchor a solid defense, with Chris Foley manning the goalkeeper position. The Gamecocks have shut out nine opponents this season, with the only home loss of the year coming from South Region foe Wake Forest.



Akron: The Zips, under the direction of eighth-year head coach Steve Parker are 10-5-3. Leading Akron is All-America candidate Neil Turnbull at the fullback position and leading returning scorers Laci Jalics and Davis Wells. Jalics






Howard: The Bison, this past year's NCAA runner-up, are coached by Keith Tucker and have a 9-3-2 record. Howard is led by this past season's NCAA Co-Most Valuable Defensive Player Shaka Hislop. This past year as goalkeeper, he allowed only seven goals in 19 matches. Mike and Irving Williams, Chris Conti and Chris Thomas also look to stop opposing offenses on the defensive side for the Bison. All-America candidate Peter Isaacs leads the offense. In 1988, Isaacs totaled 12 goals and six assists. He is joined by Anthony Laird, Harold Heath and Sheldon Jones.





USC Football Preview

Game 9: USC travels to Tallahassee, Fla., Saturday, for a 2 p.m. game against the sixthranked Florida State Seminoles at Doak Campbell Stadium. Records: USC is 5-2-1; FSU is

6-2-0. Series history: FSU leads the series 12-3-0 (6-1 at Tallahassee).

Last meeting: Nov. 5, 1988, Williams-Brice Stadium. In a nationally televised contest, the Seminoles dominated USC. handing the Gamecocks their worst home loss ever, 59-0.

The Seminoles returned a blocked punt for a touchdown and ended the first half with 31-0 lead. USC's Todd Ellis completed only nine of 23 passes for 79 yards and three interceptions. Harold Green ran for only 77 yards on 21 carries as the Gamecocks dropped from 15th place in the national rankings.

The coaches: USC's Sparky Woods, in his first season as head coach, has a record of 5-2-1. In his four years at Appalachian State, Woods was named Southern Conference Coach of the Year for three consecutive seasons between 1985-88. His overall record now stands at 43-21-3.

Florida State's Bobby Bowden is in his 14th season with the Seminoles, where he has compiled a 118-40-3 record. He holds the third highest victory total for an active coach with an overall record of 191-72-3 in 24 seasons.

Next week: USC travels to Chapel Hill for a 2 p.m. kickoff against the Tarheels of North Carolina. Florida State has the week off.


