Team's performance pleases Coach Wilson

Coach Nancy Wilson is pleased with USC's accomplishments this year.

And why not? The Lady Gamecocks finished 24-9 and reached the final 16 of the NCAA basketball tournament.

But she does have a couple of regrets, too.

"I'm very pleased," she said. "But I think with any season you have a couple of things you wish were a little bit better."

Wilson's biggest disappointment was the Lady Gamecocks' 90-65 loss to N. C. State in front of 1,850 fans at Carolina Coliseum.

"I wish we had played better . . . because we had our biggest crowd there. I think we could have really built on that if it had been a good game for us," Wilson said.

All of the Lady Gamecocks' losses were to teams ranked in the top 25 — and each of those teams survived the first round of the NCAA tournament, with four making it to the Sweet 16 and three the final eight.

USC beat six teams that made the NCAA field.

"At the beginning of the season, we looked at this team and thought they could play competitively with the best teams in the country," Wilson said. "I believe we did that."

"I also believe in getting ourselves to the final 16, and having to beat the Big 10 winner (Northwestern) on their home court, proves we're legitimately one of the top 16 teams in the country."

The Lady Gamecocks, whose season ended with a loss to Washington last week, were led all season by junior Beth Hunt. The 6-foot-2-inch forward was named the Metro Conference player of the year, averaging 22.7 points and 10.2 rebounds a game.

Karen Middleton, a 5-10 junior, averaged 13.2 points and ranked 11th in the nation in 3-point shooting percentage at 46.9 percent.

The Lady Gamecocks lose two seniors, co-captains Schonna Banner, who averaged 12.6 points and 7.7 rebounds, and Lisa Diaz, who averaged 12 points and 4.2 assists.
