

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
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

Dear Graduating Senior,

As we countdown the final days of this Spring 1990 semester, I want to be sure you have the most up-todate information regarding your Commencement. First, I want to be sure to tell you that our number one priority is to get you, and your guests, the number of seats you need. President Holderman has decreed that we will accept no special ticket requests to your Commencement from internal or external groups. I also want you to know that we have chosen to use our ticket distribution process not to limit access to Commencement, but rather to insure that you will have the maximum number of seats available. Ticket distribution provides seats for students and their guests and also eliminates access typically provided to the

The following should help to explain the Ticket Distribution Process and offer you other important

1. TICKET DISTRIBUTION INFORMATION:

Commencement Tickets will be distributed Wednesday, April 25 - Friday, April 27, 1990 (10:00 am - 6:00 pm) in the Russell House Lobby (in the same manner that we distribute athletic tickets). All graduates will be provided with up to four (4) tickets. One of these is for you (you will need a ticket to enter the Coliseum) and three (3) will be for your guests. At the same time you pick up your tickets, you may request to be on the Lottery List for additional tickets that will be available at the end of this first round of ticket distribution. All additional ticket requests will be assigned in a lottery which will be posted, and picked up, on Monday, April 30, 1990. You will be provided with specific Lottery List ticket distribution information when you put your name on that list. If you need special arrangements for ticket pick-up, you will need to contact the Student Affairs Office in writing, by April 27, 1990. You cannot be guaranteed tickets after this time. All graduates need a ticket to participate in Commencement.

2. COMMENCEMENT SCHEDULE:

Within the next two weeks, you will be receiving a letter with further detailed information from the Registrar's Office regarding the exact manner and time to enter the Coliseum on Commencement Day. Please watch for it. It will be important for you to be familiar with the information contained therein. 3. IMPORTANT INFORMATION:

■ Your Commencement Address will be given by President George Bush. In attendance will be other dignitaries including the First Lady Barbara Bush; Mr. Andrew Lloyd Webber, World Acclaimed Composer; and Mr. Michael Eisner, CEO of Disney. Truly, your Commencement proves to be exciting


■ We have received word that SC/ETV will broadcast your graduation live throughout South Carolina for those who cannot attend, and for those who would rather watch the ceremony from their homes. This will also allow you to videotape the ceremony with your VCR. ■ Overflow space will be located in the Law School Auditorium (just across the street from the Coliseum).

This space will be provided for anyone who arrives after 9:00 am (when the Coliseum will be secured by

the Secret Service for the President's arrival) and for those who arrive without tickets. No one (including graduates) will be allowed to enter the Coliseum without a ticket. ■ Special Performances at the Koger Center will also highlight Commencement Weekend.
