HOMECOMING QUEEN RULES AND REGULATIONS HOMECOMING QUEEN CRITERIA

1. The candidate must be single, full-time student with a minimum of 12 hours completed at the beginning of the fall semester.
2. The candidate must have an accumulated average of 2.25 or above.
3. The entry fee of \$20 must accompany the entry form. Make checks payable to USC.
4. Deadline for entry is Friday, September 21 at 5 pm. Entry forms should be delivered to the Campus Activities Center located in the lower level of Russell House.
5. There will be no campaigning in terms of banners, flyers and buttons. Each candidate will have a picture taken by a person designated by the Commission. The posters will be distributed to strategic locations around campus by the Commission. Verbal campaigning is encouraged.

QUEEN AND COURT DUTIES

1. The Court must attend various Homecoming events such as Cockfest and half-time rehearsals. Schedules of all such events will be distributed to finalists.
2. The Court is required to be present during Cockfest on Friday, October 12th. The Queen will be introduced during the pregame show on Saturday, October 13th.
3. Each Court member is responsible for obtaining her own escort for Cockfest.
4. The elected Queen is required to be present at the 1991 Cockfest Pep Rally to give up her reign.
5. The Queen may be asked to participate in other programs which represent the University and community.

SELECTION PROCESS

1. There will be an informal meeting of all candidates on Wednesday, September 26 in Russel House, room 327, at 4 pm. The judging procedure will be explained and any questions candidates may have will be answered. If possible, the reigning Queen will be available to answer questions.
2. Pictures will be made after the meeting for the campaign poster, so dress appropriately. Attendance is **MANDATORY** and it is up to the sponsoring organization to make sure that their candidate knows about the meeting.
3. Interviews for Homecoming Queen candidates will be held Sunday, September 30 in the Russell House.
4. All contestants **MUST ATTEND THE INTERVIEWS** or they will be dropped from the competition. Five contestants will be selected at the end of the interviews. Unless grievance is filed, the five will be notified following the grievance period.
5. The five finalists will then be voted on by the Student Body. The voting will take place on Wednesday, October 10. No write-ins will be accepted. In case of an exact tie, run-off elections will be held on the Thursday or Friday prior to Homecoming. The election results will be announced during Cockfest. The Queen will be crowned, and the other four contestants will comprise the Court.

SELECTION OF JUDGES

1. The commission members will submit names of faculty and alumni.
2. From that slate, five judges will be picked.
3. The slate of judges will be a cross section of appropriate classification, i.e., faculty, staff, minority, greek, non-greek, and alumni.

GRIEVANCE PROCEDURE

1. Grievances must be filed within 24 hours after the last interview. The candidate has 24 hours from the time of the grievance is filed to present a written grievance. Once a grievance is filed, no announcement regarding the five finalists will be made until the Hearing Committee has reached a verdict.
2. The only person who can file a grievance is the candidate.
3. At the time of the grievance filing, the candidate will be informed that the grievance hearing will be on Tuesday, October 2.
4. During the course of the hearing, an oral presentation by the candidate will be required.
5. The chairperson of the judges will present the judges' viewpoint on the grievance and the Hearing Committee.
6. The Hearing Committee shall be the Commissioner, Queen's Chairperson, Program Advisor, and the Chairperson of the judges panel.
7. After the hearing, the candidate and chairperson of the judges' panel will be asked to leave. The Hearing Committee will discuss and decide if they feel there is a valid grievance. The candidate will be contacted and informed of the Committee's decision. If determined valid the selection process will be rescheduled with a new panel of judges selected from the Commission approved slate. All applicants will go through the process again.
