



OFFICER CANDIDATE CLASS PROGRAM

The OCC program provides a college senior or graduate with the opportunity to earn an active duty commission as a Second Lieutenant in the Marine Corps. Each year, three Officer Candidate School classes meet at Quantico, Virginia. One in June, Oct. and Feb. The Officer Selection Team in South Carolina is allowed to submit three applications per class. You are screened to determine if you are academically, physically, and morally fit to wear the distinguished "Eagle, Globe, and Anchor" of an Officer of the Marines. Your application is then forwarded to Washington, D.C. where a board convenes to select the best, nationwide, from each State's submissions.
