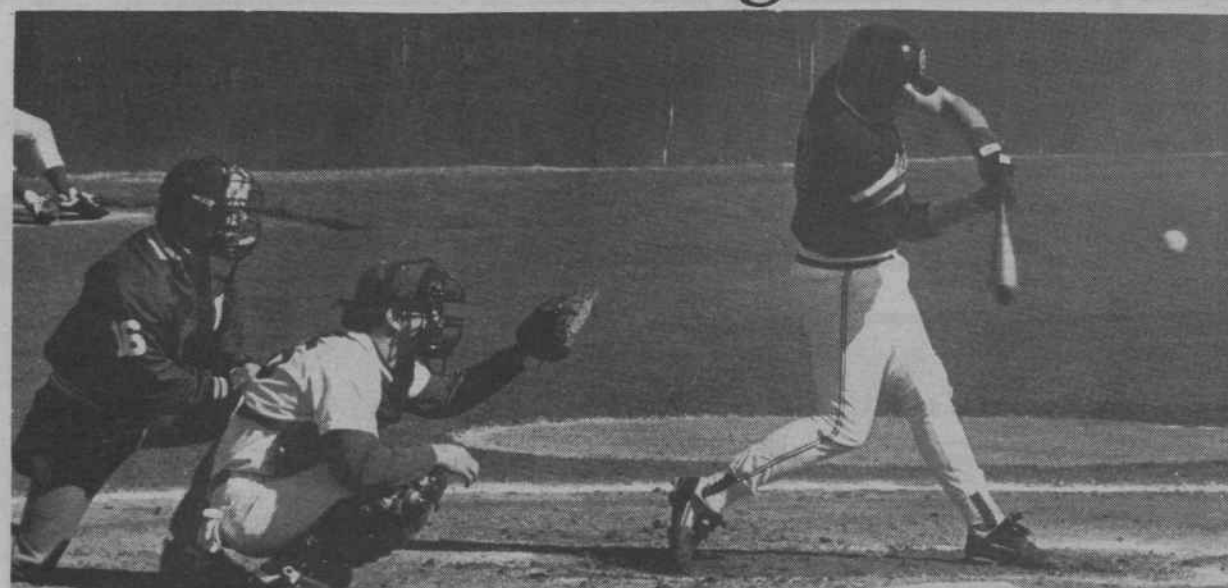


White hits the heights as USC crushes Golden Eagles 17-7

USC freshman outfielder Mac White revealed the "Mac-Attack" Sunday, providing five hits as the Gamecocks downed Southern Mississippi 17-7 to salvage the final game of a three-game Metro Conference baseball series.

White, the center fielder, was moved to the leadoff position in the lineup after the Gamecocks had dropped two games in a row in Hattiesburg. White singled and scored in the first inning, doubled in the second, singled and scored in the fifth, doubled and scored to open up the seven-run eighth inning, and beat out an infield single for the final hit of that inning.

Junior shortstop Randy Thomp-

son hit his first home run of the season, a two-run shot in the eighth inning and sophomore first baseman Jeff Parnell led off the ninth inning with his eighth homer of the year.

Sophomore pitcher Sean Hardwick picked up his fifth win against no losses, but the Gamecocks kept the bullpen busy by using four pitchers. Sophomore pitcher Rob Mosser entered in the seventh inning with two outs and the bases loaded with USC leading 7-6 to earn his second save of the season.

Junior outfielder Jerry Shepherd added three singles to extend his hitting streak to 18 games.

USC improved their record to 18-5 with the win over the Golden

Eagles (11-9) Sunday. The win was a big one for USC as Southern Miss finished second in the Metro this past season and still figure to be among the league leaders at the end of this year's campaign.

The Gamecocks were scheduled to face Louisville (7-9) in a twin-night doubleheader Tuesday and will end the three-game home series against the Cardinals today at 3 p.m.

Louisville is traditionally one of the weakest teams in the Metro and this year figures to be no different. Cardinal pitching is a definite weak spot. The staff has a combined 6.28 earned run average so far this season.
