- Suits should be traditional single-breasted, navy or grey pinstriped, expertly tailored and well-pressed. AVOID: sports jackets and slacks.

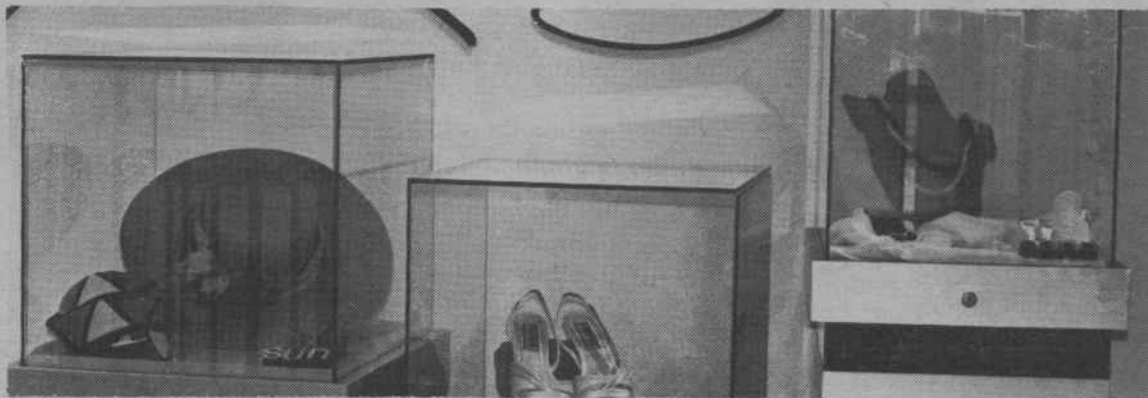
- Classic dress shoes that tie are a must, and they should always be freshly shined. Socks should be mid- or over-the-calf in brown,

- The face should always be clean-shaven and hair should be cut regularly in a conservative style. Nails should be groomed at least once a week. AVOID: not always being clean-shaven, wearing hair in the latest avant-garde style, and biting your nails.

- A classic style watch with a leather or metal band is a must. AVOID: not wearing a watch.

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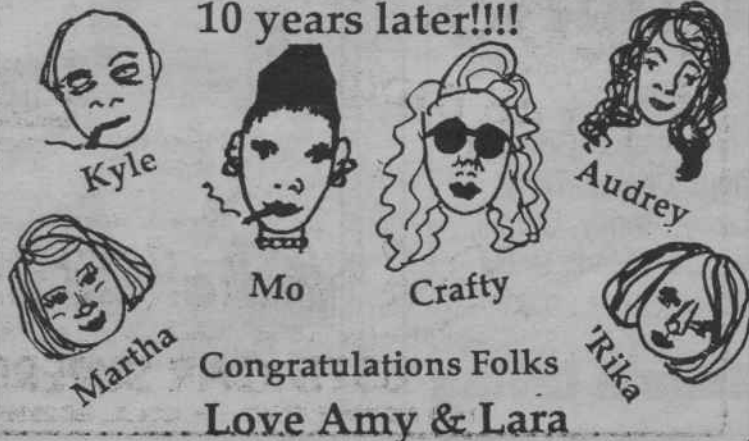
