Washam wins individual award, Moore named outstanding dorm

Several people from USC were recognized earlier this month for their excellence in service at this year's Community Service Reception:

■ **Joni Washam, Outstanding Individual Volunteer** — hours. She is a volunteer for Palmetto AIDS Life Support Services Inc., where she is a team leader for the buddy program.

■ **Habitat for Humanity at USC, Student Organization** that logs the most service hours for the year. This group is involved in providing housing renovation and restoration to families in need.

■ **Medical Student Association, Outstanding Student Organization — Projects.** This group has performed blood and cholesterol screenings, AIDS education programs, tutoring efforts and works in the Columbia Free Medical Clinic.

■ **Moore Residence Hall, Outstanding Residence Hall of the Year.** This hall registered the most service projects with the office for their work with Epworth Children's Home, Habitat for Humanity and the American Red Cross.

■ **Bowling Club at USC, Student Organization** that

raises the largest donation for a community cause. This group raised \$8,274 in a tournament for the American Cancer Society.

■ **Pi Kappa Phi, Outstanding Greek Letter Organization of the Year.** This organization has had ongoing projects with Camp Burnt Gin in Sumter where they have developed a nature trail that is completely accessible to the disabled. They have also worked with the Adopt a Highway Program and SC-ETV.

■ **Ray Davis, Outstanding Faculty/Staff Effort in Service.** He has developed a volunteer program in the university's Career Center and is active in other service organizations.

Campus Coalition for Literacy recognized Beth Bangston as an outstanding member of the group for her work with Story Time. The program focuses on encouraging children to read at an early age. Sarah Cobbs was also honored for her outstanding service in literacy in logging the highest number of hours for the year in adult tutoring in Richland One's Adult Reading Programs.

Carolina Cares recognized Delta Delta Delta for organizing the most projects during Carolina Cares Week and the Student Alumni Association for the largest charitable donation for the week. The group also recognized Stephanie Myrick-Pendarvis for outstanding leadership and Devin Beaver as most dedicated member.

morning there is a great need for a foundation because of research practices," Warren said.

Trustee Mark Buyck said members of a foundation should be more representative of the state and nation.

"I think the foundation should have more geographic representatives. Currently, the foundation is representative of Columbia. It would be far more beneficial to

to a wider spectrum," Buyck said.

Buyck proposed the foundation board have nine to 15 members. The board would consist of three to six members appointed by the Board of Trustees; three to six appointed by the president of USC; one appointed by the Alumni Association board; one appointed by the Board of Visitors; and one trustee.

"The president should serve as

an ex-officio non-voting member of the board. The chief financial officer should be another one, too," Buyck said.

Warren said the day's comments need to be examined.

"I don't even know if we have all the answers, given our fine researching items," Warren said. "However, from now on, we do have to be good custodians for money put in our hands."

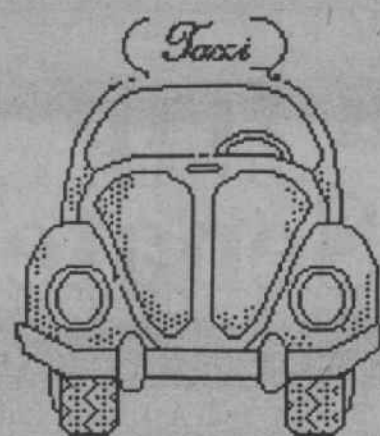
