Faults

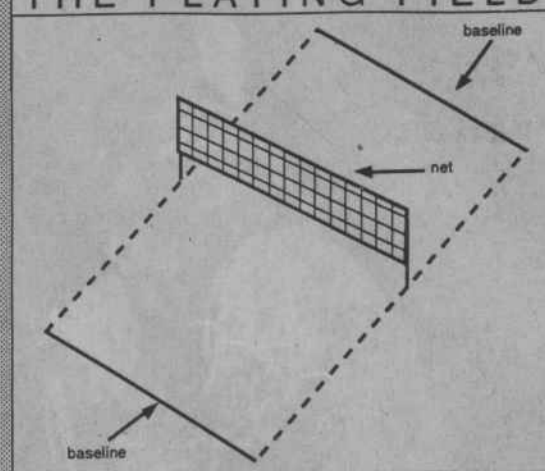
- Hitting net on serve
