



Men's tennis to take on Georgia,

The USC men's tennis team, ranked No. 18 in the latest Rolex Collegiate Tennis Poll, will face stiff challenges Thursday against No. 2 Georgia and Saturday against No. 13 Ole Miss.

The Gamecocks (11-4, 1-4) suffered a slight setback Sunday against LSU, falling 4-2 to the Bengal Tigers in Baton Rouge, La. However, USC pulled off one of its biggest upsets ever by stunning then-No. 4 Duke Wednesday

in Durham, N.C.

Carolina's grueling schedule will continue as the Bulldogs roll into Columbia with six wins against Top 20 opponents. Their most recent victory was a 7-0 thumping of Vanderbilt. Georgia (10-2, 5-1) hasn't lost on

the road this season, while USC is 9-1 at home. A key matchup for both squads will be the No. 1 singles match between

Johan Sandberg and Georgia All-American Mike Sell.

Sandberg is ranked No. 42 in the

latest polls, while Sell has recently returned to the Bulldogs No. 1 spot after suffering a back injury in the fall. The men battled two years ago in Columbia when both were playing No. 2 singles.

Another key to Gamecock success could be the doubles point. When USC takes two of three doubles matches to capture the doubles point, Carolina is 6-2. When the Gamecocks lose the point, they are 1-2.

The Gamecocks' top two doubles teams, Sandberg/Jose Frontera and Maxsy Jimenez/Jim Panagopoulos, are a combined 17-5 this season.

USC hasn't defeated Georgia since 1990, with the Bulldogs sweeping the Gamecocks 7-0 in their last meeting, in Athens, Ga.

Results from the Georgia match and a preview of the Ole Miss match will appear in Friday's edition. .

Both the Georgia and Mississippi matches will begin at 2 p.m. at the Sam Daniels Tennis Center.
