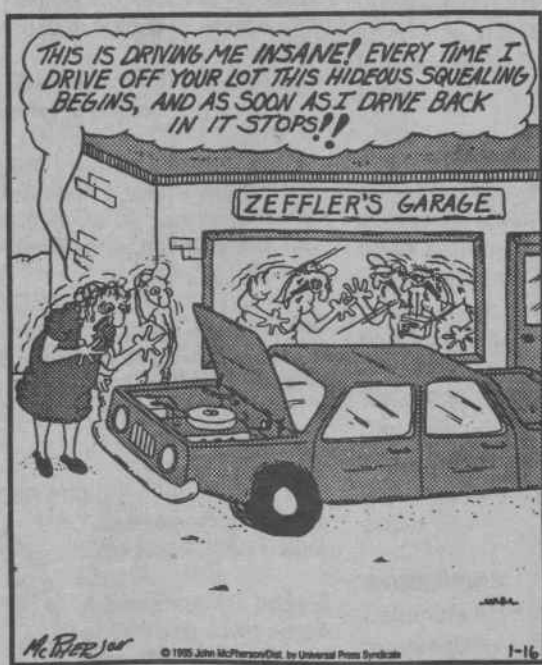

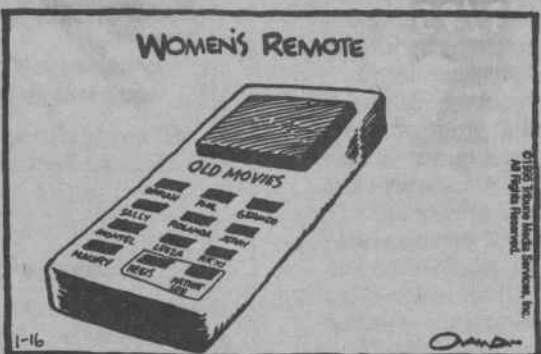
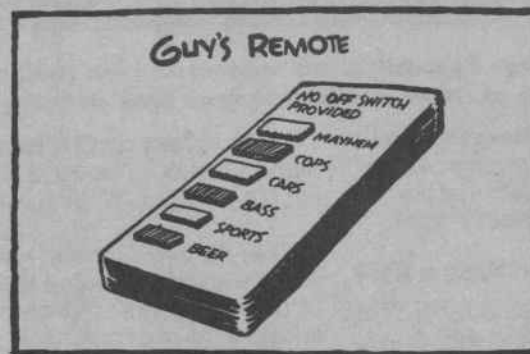


Ted's balloon angioplasty procedure gets off to a rough start.

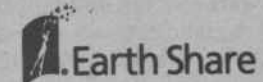
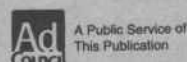
Drink out of mugs instead of throwaway cups.
