# Gamecocks look to rebound against unbeaten Gators

The Gamecock football team will face its toughest challenge this Saturday night against the No. 3 Florida Gators. How can it get any worse, you ask?

First, it was a whipping by the Bulldogs between the hedges: 42-23. The next week, this season's SEC West champion Arkansas, got revenge for last season's shut out in a big way, 51-21. Two weeks after that, the Gamecocks were beaten badly by a No. 5 Tennessee team, 56-21 in Knoxville. And now they come home to face the third-best team in the country in front of a national television audience, watching on ESPN.

-Carolina enters this week after an open date on their schedule. The Gators nter the game after what could be considered an open week. UF ripped Northern Illinois without starting quarterback Danny Wuerffel. Wuerffel was replaced by back-up Eric Kresser, who had a record- setting day. Wuerffel, however, was not injured. Coach Steve Spurrier just didn't see any need in playing him against the team from the mighty Big West conference.

Wow, now that's a slap in the face for you. It's not enough for a program with the strength and tradition of Northern Illinois to have to play in Gainesville, but then to have the reserves start against

The Gators are undefeated and looking for a national championship; they are hoping to pick up their third straight SEC championship in the process. The Gamecocks are just hoping they don't become another victim of a Gator attack. The Gamecocks must win both of their remaining games, including Nov.18 against Clemson, to go to a bowl game.

The Gamecocks will once again be led by quarterback Steve Taneyhill, who might be the best signal caller to ever wear the garnet and black (or at least in my lifetime). Steve has had a recordsetting season and is a All-American

This week he will face the man who stole the SEC offensive player of the week honors from him a month ago after the Mississippi State game, Danny Wuerffel. Taneyhill had the best offensive performance in the nation that Saturday, or at least "Sports Illustrated" and the U.S. Postal Service thought so, but the SEC honors still went to Wuerffel, whose numbers didn't compare.

This week the two highly touted quarterbacks bring the top two scoring offenses in the SEC to Williams-Brice Stadium for what could be an offensive show-

Look for freshman wide receiver Zola Davis and senior wide receiver Monty Means to both have a big day for the Gamecocks. They both have nine TDs each and are one touchdown away from the single season record for touchdowns held by Sterling Sharpe, who scored 10

Wuerffel's numbers on Saturday will depend a lot on his top two wideouts, Chris Doering and Ike Hilliard, who lead the team in receptions with 40 and 36 respectively. The two also have 12 and nine TDs respectively.


The Carolina defense will have to come up big this week if the Gamecocks are to have a chance against the Gators.

The defense will once again be led by senior nose tackle Eric Sullivan. Eric leads the team with eight sacks and two tackles for loss. Defensive back Ben Washington and linebacker Ronnie Smith lead the team in tackles respectively. Washington has recorded 75 and Smith has

Defensively for UF, look out for All-SEC nicklebacker Ben Hanks, who has 53 tackles, two sacks and four tackles for loss. The defensive secondary is also very good for the Gators. The secondary is led by junior all-star candidates strong safety Lawrence Wright and cornerback Anthone Lott. The two are first and third on the team in tackles with 74 and 66 respectively.

The Gator's lead the series 9-3-3 and have won the last four meetings including the three conference meetings. Last season UF won in Gainesville by the score of 48-21. Two seasons ago Carolina was defeated in Columbia by the score of 37-

To have a chance to win, the Carolina offense has to have a good day. Two weeks ago the Gamecocks had the chance to jump on top of Tennessee early but


