The College of Liberal Arts has named Robert F. Lyon of Auburn University as chairman of the art department. Before joining Auburn's art department as chairman in 1995, Lyon was an art professor at Louisiana State University. He has held prestigious artist-in-residence positions at the Sculpture Space Inc. in Utica, N.Y., the Banff Center in Alberta, Canada, and the Kohler Company in Kohler, Wis. He is the recipient of a Visual Artists Fellowship in Sculpture by the National Endowment for the Arts and is founder and editor in chief of "The Sculpture News."
