

Special Olympics needs volunteers in Columbia

Special Olympics Summer Games, featuring a variety of Olympic-type sports, will take place at two locations in the Columbia area: Fort Jackson and the University of South Carolina.

More than 800 athletes from South Carolina will compete in Athletics (track and field), Aquatics (swimming), Softball and Bowling.

The event incorporates 300 coaches and 500 volunteers from the Columbia area.

Adult volunteers are needed to serve in many event capacities, from sports venues to food service.

The event will begin May 16 with a softball competition in the afternoon at Fort Jackson and with Opening Ceremonies on the post at 7:30 p.m.

On May 17 adult volunteers are needed for the following sports competitions:

8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Athletics at Patton Stadium, Fort Jackson

8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Softball at Hilton Softball Complex, Fort Jackson

9 a.m. to 1 p.m. Bowling at Century Lanes, Fort Jackson

9 a.m. to 2 p.m. Aquatics, USC Blatt P.E. Center

A victory celebration and closing ceremonies will be held May 17 at Cole Park Tennis Courts, Fort Jackson.

The public is invited to attend all ceremonies and events.

South Carolina Special Olympics is a year-round training and competition program for children and adults with mental retardation.

Summer Games is one of three state-level events held each year in addition to local and regional

competitions.
